All pupils need to have a waterbottle everyday and a cap in sunny weather

No jewellery should be worn for school. If a child has pierced ears they may <u>wear a pair of small stud earrings</u> that they are able to take out by themselves for PE lessons.

NO Makeup or Nail varnish / False nails in school.

Hair

Any hair longer than shoulder length should be tied up with a plain bobble (black or blue) Hair accessories – small and simple please (only black / blue)

No shaved patterns are suitable for school.

If your child isn't following the uniform requirements the classteacher will remind you as parent/carer verbally on the first occasion as we understand their can sometimes be a mishap on a morning etc.

If this happens a second time, your child will be asked to miss playtime as they know the school rules and we want them to develop a sense of responsibility in following rules.

If there are further incidents we will ask you to come into school to discuss the situation with the Headteacher.

We have always had very supportive parents who do everything possible to ensure their children look smart and support the school in all its policies. We are very grateful for your

We will have a **Lunchtime Homework club** for those children who haven't completed their homework. The children will use the lunch time to catch up on any homework they haven't handed in. Children who haven't read with their parent / carer the last full week with join this club to read during the lunchtime session. **We only know if your child has read if an ADULT (not brother or sister) has signed the reading record.**


Catholic Care Worker

School Improvement Plan work in 2018/19

Some of the Key Areas we will be developing in our school this year are:

Reading is our first and main focus this year.

Do you have any school reading books or library books at home?

A member of staff did an audit of our stock in the summer holidays and we have quite a few books missing.

Please return any school reading / library books you find at home in next week....it doesn't matter how old it might be - we need them back please.

We will have to charge parents for any lost or badly damaged books this year as our budget is very tight and we want to be able to buy a wider range of books for the children to read.

To replace a book we will need to charge between £4 and £8 depending on the type of book.

Other areas we are developing are:

Maths Challenge, Collective Worship and Working together with Parents/Carers

We will keep you updated in our newsletter about what we are doing in school....but ask your children too! We will continue the work every year on Growth Mindset. We believe that children and adults can achieve amazing things if they aim high, work hard, are encouraged to overcome mistakes and celebrate together everyone's achievements.

Welcome back to the new academic year. Below you will find information about what your children will be learning in their Religious Education this half term.

Reception - God's World



"Creation is the first and universal revelation of God's love"



This half term, the children in the Nursery and the Reception classes will be learning about God's world. Throughout this topic, the children will begin to appreciate the beauty of the world and know that God made it.

They will learn that God loves and cares for each one of us and reflect on this. They will hear about and respond to the things God created for us.

They will know that God has asked us to care for the world and think of ways in which we can help to do it.

Year 1 - God's Great Plan



"As the first action of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, creation is the first step towards the covenant relationship God seeks with every human being"

The children will learn about the beauty of God's world and explore and respond to the wonders of creation e.g. the seasons. They will also hear about the story of Creation from

Genesis and talk about its meaning.

They will be reflecting on the knowledge that God made us because he loves us and develop their understanding that we show God we love him by looking after the world and each other. They will learn that we can spoil God's creation and that we have a responsibility to look after it, as well as hearing an appropriate part of the story of Noah and the Flood and its message of salvation and hope.

Year 2 - The Chosen People

"In order to gather together scattered humanity God calls Abram ... and makes him Abraham, that is, 'the father of a multitude of nations.' ... God formed Israel as his people by freeing them from slavery in Egypt ... he gave them his law so that they would recognise him and serve him as the one living and true God, the provident Father and just judge, and so that they would look for the promised Saviour."

Catechism of the Catholic Church



The children will learn that we are chosen by God and learn that God chose certain people to lead and guide his people. They will learn that God called Abraham and that God chose Moses to be a great leader. They will also learn about how Samuel responded to God's call and find out about the story of Daniel in the lions' den.

They will have an opportunity to reflect on Abraham's trust in God and learn that we should always trust God. They will learn that God chooses unexpected people and will be given the opportunity to reflect on their own response to God's call.

Year 3 - The Christian Family

"The Church is the family of God, the people that God gathers in the whole world."

The children will develop their understanding that the Church is the family of God and know that we join this family when we receive the Sacrament of Baptism. They will learn what happens at Baptism and learn about the signs used and why they are used. They will learn about the promises made by parents and godparents at Baptism and develop their understanding of the Sacrament of Baptism.

Year 4 - The Bible

"The Scriptures are the living Word of God, written under the guidance of the



Holy Spirit received and faithfully handed on within the living Tradition and teaching of the Church."

The children will learn that the Bible is a story of God's love and concern for us. They will learn that the Bible is a living book through which God speaks to us and tells us about himself. They will learn that the Bible is one story told through many different books and they will learn about Moses, David and Jonah as well as learning how to find a Bible reference.

The children will have the chance to:

- explore how the Bible helps us to pray and experience how God speaks to us in the Bible
- participate in a liturgy and experience a guided meditation on a text from the Bible.

Year 5 - Gifts from God

"Each human person is unique and made in God's image and likeness"

The children will learn the story of Creation and the Fall in the Book of Genesis. They will learn that we are all created in the image and likeness of God and know that God calls us to care for others and all creation with love and respect. They will learn that there are times when we fail to be good stewards of creation. They will also learn that there are people who show great respect for creation and for the weakest members of society.

The children will have the chance to:

- appreciate how we can show respect for ourselves, for others and for God.
- reflect on times we have failed to show respect and reflect on the gifts and talents God has given each of us.
- reflect on the use and misuse we can make of these gifts.

Year 6—Called to Serve

"The gifts of the Holy Spirit enable us to share the mission of the Church."

The children will learn about Jesus' teaching and example of service of others. They will develop their ability to recognise that God has given us all gifts and talents to use in the service of him and his people. They will learn about the gifts of the Holy Spirit and understand that we receive these gifts in a special way through the Sacrament of Confirmation. The children will have an opportunity to reflect on a life of service through the role of the priest, religious and married life.
