### **Building Work – starting in the holiday**

We are having some essential repairs to our school roof this year. The work will start in the half term holiday and will last approximately 4 weeks. To ensure everyone is safe whilst the work is carried out there will be some security fencing in the playground. This will restrict access to the area immediately in front of school.

**If you are arriving late to school or collecting your child for an appointment please accompany your child up the drive on foot.**

There will be builders and equipment in the staff car park until the work is completed so there won't be any space for additional cars.

**Please keep your child away from the temporary fencing in the playground before and after school.**

### **VCS contributions – Building repairs**

At parents evening next week we will put a VCS (Voluntary Contribution Scheme) form in all our children's trays so that anyone who hasn't already contributed this year has the opportunity to do so as soon as possible.

**The school will need to contribute approximately £8000 towards the roof repairs.** This should come from funds raised by our school families. It is essential that all families contribute in some way to ensure their child has the best learning environment possible. **We ask if you could contribute £3 a month per child by standing order or cash contributions if preferred across the year.**

**Huge thanks to all those families who have contributed every year since their child started school.**

If we can't pay this bill we will be unable to apply for future work on the school until the amount is raised.

### **Parent Governor Election**

#### **The role of the governing board**

The school's governing board is responsible for providing confident and strategic leadership, and creating robust accountability, oversight and assurance for the school's educational and financial performance. The board is passionate about education and committed to continuous school improvement to ensure the best possible outcomes for our pupils.

#### **The role of a parent governor**

As a parent governor, you'll work with the board to ensure it effectively carries out the duties referred to above. You'll also play a vital role in ensuring that the board is connected with, and is aware of the views of, parents and the local community.

#### **To be a parent governor you should have:**

- A strong commitment to the role and to improving outcomes for children
- Good inter-personal skills, curiosity, and a willingness to learn and develop new skills
- The specific skills required to ensure the governing board delivers effective governance

#### **The governing board is keen for candidates who have skills and knowledge in the following:**

- Understanding the mission of a Catholic school and Catholic education generally
- Knowledge of school and local community
- Legal
- Problem solving and/or creativity
- HR expertise

#### **Expectations of governors:**


- Attendance at meetings – 5 full Governing Body Meetings a year (1 ½ -2 hours) 3 subcommittee meetings (1-1 ½ hours) Our meetings are held in the evening starting at 6.15pm.
- Maintaining confidentiality
- Committing to training – all New Governors are expected to attend an induction course and attend at least one course at the Diocese a year (evenings)
- Visiting the school – Governors are linked to specific areas for development and we ask them to visit school at least once a year during the school year to support the self-evaluation of the school.

If you're interested in applying for the role, please complete the candidate form sent home last week and **return to the school office by Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> October.** If we receive more applications than there are vacancies, a secret ballot will be carried out. We will inform you closer to the time if we have to do this.
