The day on which Jesus was Crucified and died.




The Passion:

#### **COATS**

Please make sure you child has a coat every day as the weather can change quickly and they are outside for an hour at lunchtime. If it is warm and dry they are allowed to leave them on their peg.

## **Voluntary Contributions Scheme** – Please read the important information

#### What is it?

When your child joined our school we explained that as a Catholic School we get a sum of money each year to help maintain our building / refurbish and replace ICT hardware. The annual amount has reduced over the years and for larger projects we have to bid for additional funding.

St Patrick's has been successful in our bids for additional funds over the years to ensure our school is providing the best we can for your children.

### Projects over the last few years with approx. costs:

- 2014 Electrical Re-wire of the school COST £100, 000
- 2015- Extension to the main building Reception and Year 1 classrooms COST £500,000
- **2016** Old leaking windows replaced **COST £8000**
- 2017 Access ramp to the front of the school COST £30,000
- 2018 Essential Roof repairs to prevent leaks into classrooms COST £80,000
- 2019 Toilet Refurbishments COST £20,000 planned for Summer 2019

As a Catholic School we have to contribute 10% of the total cost for all of these projects. Over the years parents have been very generous by contributing regularly to the VCS (Voluntary Contribution Scheme). We have asked all parents to contribute £30 a year per child to help raise these funds. Some parents of past pupils still contribute to support the school.

### UNFORTUNATELY, ONLY 46 FAMILIES HAVE CONTRIBUTED SO FAR THIS YEAR.

We have fallen very short of the £8,000 contribution for the roof repairs as we have only raised approx. £2,000 so far and we will have an additional £2,000 to pay by the end of summer.


