

Our current Virtue to live by...faith

Faith is about placing our trust in God or Jesus. There are many examples in the gospels when Jesus told people not to give up especially when they thought something was impossible or because they were afraid. Jesus asked them to have faith. Faith is a gift that comes from knowing and living what you believe no matter what happens. Our friendship with Jesus needs to deepen if our faith is to grow. If we are faithful this will show itself by a life filled with trust, hope and love. As we enter the spring term we pray for the pupils in Y6 and Y4 as they take the next steps on their faith journey and prepare for the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion.

We are finally nearing the completion of the building works. The governors and I are delighted with the first- class built environment we have managed to develop so far. The Boys and Reception toilets are set to be refurbished in February and new display boards will finally complete the work for now. Please read every day with your child at home; share a story together each day.

Book exchanges – The book exchanges are open for business. Remember you can bring in any good quality book from home and exchange it for a new book in the main entrance and for our younger readers, outside Reception class. There are some great titles and there is something for everyone.

Reading Ambassadors – The Reading Ambassadors are busy choosing books for the new school library and the class libraries. They will also be recording books that will be put on Google Classroom for your child to access at home.

After-School clubs begin next week

A letter came home yesterday to KS2, please return it as soon as you can so that we can allocate spaces. Clubs are open to everyone and the majority are free. Lego club is taking a break this term and will be replaced by Film club for Y3 and Y4. The children will watch a film over 2 weeks and then review them. If your child is given a place in Film club a separate permission letter will need to be signed. Please note we have a number of clubs at lunchtime run by sports coaches for children in Reception and KS1. We also have our brass band practising at lunchtime and we very much look forward to the spring music concert when they will perform again.

Key skills practice and website support

Keep practicing those key skills of Reading, Spelling and Maths each day at home. Your child's class curriculum was shared in September but can also found on the website https://www.stpatricksleeds.org.uk under the Parent tab then Classes. A spring 2024 newsletter will shortly be uploaded on the website for every class. The website has links to different websites to support learning in all subjects and your child has passwords to access key resources such as TTRS. Remember to click on the globe in the top left-hand corner to explore the range of languages that the website can be translated into.







FOSP – Family Movie Night 8th February

We are trialing a new event to raise much needed funds for school. We are showing the Disney movie Encanto on the big screen in the hall. We will also be showing the film in a classroom for families with children who have SEN – this will be a more relaxed space. A family ticket costs £5 and up to 5 people can attend on the ticket. The film will begin at 5pm and conclude at 7.15pm, this includes a short break in the middle. Families are welcome to bring their own drinks and snacks – No products containing nuts please. We are also hoping to run a tuck shop and popcorn stand. A letter will come home shortly regarding this event – please note we will have to limit the number of tickets and these will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

RSHE (Relationship, Sex and Health Education)

All 7 classes will this be taught RSHE this term. The RSHE curriculum is well embedded here at St.Patrick's and we feel confident that our pupils begin high school with all the knowledge they need in this area and the results of our annual pupil surveys tell us so. The focus of RSHE in primary schools is on the fundamental building blocks of positive relationships with a particular emphasis on friendships, family relationships as well as other types of relationships with other children and adults.
