#### **Y1 Phonics**

We had a super turnout for the Phonics meeting, including all the teaching staff in school. In Y1, our children are required to sit a phonic screener in June. This will set them on the way to becoming successful readers and writers. Little and often is what children at this age need. # Admission to Reception class for September 2020

The Leeds City Council online portal is now open for applications from prospective parents whose children are eligible to join school in September 2020. If you are wishing to apply, you must do so online and also complete the school's SIF (Supplementary Information Form). These are available on the school website and from the school office. I will be holding two informal tours of the school for prospective parents on the 18<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> November in the afternoon. ## **Car Parking and Picking Up**

PC Power, our community police officer, is continuing to monitor parking arrangements at the end of the school day. #### Attendance

We have recently worked alongside our local Attendance Officer to review our school attendance policy and bring our procedures in-line with our cluster and other local schools. The policy will be published on our website soon. Here are some of the main points from the policy:

- Parents MUST contact school and inform us of the reason for every absence, on the first day of absence and each day thereafter.
- Parents will be kept regularly informed of their child's attendance, particularly if it falls below 90% (you will receive a letter and may be invited in for a meeting to discuss if attendance does not improve).
- Any holidays taken during term time will not be authorised (unless in exceptional circumstances and this is only at the headteacher's discretion) and school will now have to refer for a Penalty Notice (fine) if children are taken on holiday during term time.
- Our registration period will officially close at 9.15am for the morning session. Children arriving before 9.15am will be marked 'Late L code'. Arrival after 9.15am will be unauthorised absence for the session ('U code'), unless this is due to a pre-arranged medical appointment and school are aware of this. Hospital appointment letters must be brought to the school office, so that the absence can be coded correctly.
- Mrs Newton is now our school Attendance Officer and is working closely
  with our Cluster Attendance Office to ensure that our school attendance
  stays as excellent as it always has been. If you have any queries or
  questions regarding school attendance, please speak to Mrs Newton.
