Key Messages – COVID

The guidance has changed somewhat from my last newsletter with routine testing now stopping. This does not mean however that we are living in a Covid free world – far from it. The latest guidance for schools states we should continue to monitor the situation

4 Key Control Measures continue to stay in place

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.

Symptoms and Testing Positive – It is important we continue to prevent the spread of Covid, so that school can continue to run effectively. If staff are poorly with Covid (as adults generally are) they will be off work. This effects the provision and the day-to-day running of individual classes. Therefore as per the latest guidance, we ask that if your child is symptomatic with any of the following you seek a test-

- *a new continuous cough
- *a high temperature
- *a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

The DfE guidance states that children who test positive should now stay at home for 3 days and isolate. If adults test positive they should try to isolate at home for 5 days. Free testing for coronavirus (COVID-19) from the NHS has now ended for most people in England. If your child is unwell with a high temperature they should not be in school. They should only return when they feel well.





Interventions

Target groups of children across school are being asked to attend - this additional support will be continuing indefinitely. These are being run before and after school and also at lunchtime (for short sessions). This is costly to school but we will do all we can to get children to agerelated expectations – parents/carers need to play their part too and ensure they arrive on time, are collected promptly and attend every session.

Running Club – beginning Tuesday 4th May

Mrs Grady and Miss Owen will be leading this – lunchtime Tuesday and Thursday. We are opening this initially to Y4, Y5 and Y6. This will be on the school field (weather permitting) and it's all about raising personal fitness levels and increasing your personal best. The children will eat after the club has finished. If it not your PE day and you wish to join in, please bring a change of clothes.

Parent's Evenings – Tuesday 26th and Wednesday 27th April

There are still a few families who have not yet made an appointment. Please contact the office to make one. During the meeting you will have the opportunity to discuss your child's progress and review any target areas. We have managed to fulfil all requests for online or face-to-face appointments. Online appointment links will be sent by email on the day of the appointment. Face-to-face meetings will be held in the hall. Please enter through the main playground gate. To limit numbers on site we ask that only one adult attends and no children. Please wear a mask during the appointment, this is essentially to protect the staff who will be talking to lots of people over the course of both evenings.

Whole school priority – Fluency in Maths

Every child has access to Numbots (KS1) and Times Table Rockstars – they are both really useful interactive tools to help develop number fluency both in school and at home.

As a school we follow the White Rose Maths Hub planning. Children are very familiar with the images and representations that are used as they move through school. White Rose have produced a free app called – 1 Minute Maths. I have trialled this at home with Ava (age 7) and she loves it! (maybe the thought of it taking just a minute is a big positive). Please click on the link and download it on your phone, device/tablet and let them have a go. A few minutes a day makes all the difference.
